A Bit about Mike

Mike Marquez has been a horseman all his life. He was raised on a ranch in the Sierra Nevada Mountains of Northern California, where his parents trained and bred Quarter Horses, Appaloosas and Welsh Ponies. He is the 5th generation on the family cattle ranch that was started in the latter half of the 1800's in Marysville, California. This lifestyle allowed him to learn early on how valuable a horse is to the success of being a working cowboy, and how important it is to master the skill of developing a horse into that valuable tool. Upon leaving college Mike went to work for Bob Smith, Tony Garcia and Dick Knight to learn from these exemplary horsemen, working with Arabians, Working Cow Horses and Cutting Horses.

In 1981 he was brought to Connecticut by El Hamal Arabians as an assistant trainer. A couple of years later he went out on his own and established Vaquero Training Center. Through the years he has trained and shown horses to multiple championships in several disciplines, including western pleasure, reining, dressage, hunter, and trail. He has worked extensively with Quarter Horses, Thoroughbreds, Warmbloods and Arabians. Youth and Amateur riders have been equally successful under his tutelage. Out of the showpen, he is best known for his skill at starting babies, and his ability to retrain horses with serious behavior and training problems.
